POSITION OVERVIEW

The Navigator is an active member of the multi-disciplinary team (MDT) and will provide case management and other support services to women who are pregnant and have histories of substance abuse (SUD). The Navigator will function as an advocate for women and their infants.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Must have personal knowledge of the recovery process and if applicable, have a minimum of 5 years clean.
- Must have the knowledge and skills to model and instruct basic life skills.
- Must have the personal qualities of responsibility, integrity, and the ability to effectively use coping tools to maintain personal safety during outreach.
- Must have a high school diploma and classes in behavioral sciences, and/or be registered or certified as a drug and alcohol counselor.
- Must be able to function well as a member of a team and have good communication skills.
- Must be open to learning about early intervention for infants.
- Must be able to articulate a holistic approach to recovery and wellness.
- Must be able to follow the Mission and Values of the agency.
- Basic computer skills preferred.

RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Advocate on behalf of clients and help them to navigate the health and social services systems and help clients to address problems and answer questions, gather and provide information and advice, and connect clients to resources in the community.
2. Work with collaborators in meeting the objective of having a strong partnership to create an efficient system of care for women with SUD and young infants.
3. Assist women in articulating personal recovery goals during outreach and/or program orientation sessions by helping them define strengths, needs, and abilities.
4. Provide in home case management, support for healthy parenting, and to create a safe environment for children.
5. Assist women in working with case managers in determining appropriate level of care and treatment plan objectives.
6. Support women in finding a sustainable social network in the community by attending self-help groups and working with a sponsor.
7. Assist women in meeting goals in the areas of physical, social, spiritual, intellectual, and occupational health.
8. Provide outreach in priority neighborhoods to homeless women who are pregnant or who have infants in their care.
9. Assist client in developing empowerment skills through self-advocacy by role modeling good decision-making, efficient time management, and healthy boundaries.
